A BRIEF REVIEW OF SOME DEVELOPMENTS AND ACTIVITIES DURING MAY 2020

Activity of the Month

May 25, 2020 Text from Bro. _____. We then talked over the phone. He had contacted me about a year ago (On March 19, 2019), and I sent him link to online materials. He is a member of a church made up of legal immigrants from former Soviet Bloc countries. These believers witnessed much persecution, and some were persecuted. He talked some about those persecutions and the problems with state registration in the old country (like no one under 18 could go to church services, etc.). He and other members are ready to do the DOT. He said they have been unsuccessfully trying to get the lead pastor and others to agree to get out of corp. 501c3 status. As a result, several families decided to peacefully withdraw and form another church in another state. They will be moving there. They have contracts to build houses. They will be moving there within 6 months, and one family has already moved there. They want to start the process of establishing the trust. They have plenty of time to get everything done correctly.

May 30, 2020 Emailed him the first mailing (initial letter; Policies, Procedures, and Guidelines; Questionnaire 1).
Note: Several of these American churches, made up of members from former Soviet Bloc nations, have executed trust documents and operate under the authority of the Lord Jesus Christ alone.

Below are some other ministry activities. The ministry worked on the website, responded to some other calls and e-mails not included below, etc.

May 4, 2020: Call from a lady who has a helps ministry for the elderly as part of the church she is a member of. She is single and her kids are grown, so she can give a lot of time to the ministry. The church wants her to get a 501(c)(3) tax exemption for the ministry. We talked for 1 hour 45 minutes. She stated that doing so was against her Holy Spirit convictions. I explained that the ministry should be under the authority of a local church. I also

explained the issue of authority—that a church should never submit to any authority other than the Lord Jesus Christ and that a church does so when it chooses to become a legal entity of anykind (corporation, 501c3 or 508c1A tax exempt religious organization, charitable trust, etc.). Her church is incorp. & 501c3. I gave her a lot of Bible verses to look at. She has been reading the material on the website and readily understood these matters. She knows of an unregistered fellowship of Christians who agree that a church should not incorporate. Etc.

May 5, 2020: Call from one of the pastors of a DOT church who is opening a new bank account. He had some questions about that which we discussed.

Dear Ms. _____,

This ministry helps churches state under Jesus Christ and Him alone. This ministry is under the authority of Charity Baptist Tabernacle of Amarillo TX. The ministry does not help non-church organizations.

However, I will give you a little information that may be of help. No organization or church has to apply for 501(c)(3) status and no church has to apply for any type of legal status such as incorporation, 501(c)(3) tax exempt status, charitable trust status. Churches in America are guaranteed religious liberty by the First Amendment to the United States Constitution. Most choose to place an authority or authorities other than the Lord Jesus Christ over them by incorporating, getting tax exempt status, etc. Those churches have a form of godliness but deny the power (authority) of God to one degree or another. The New Testament makes very clear that Christ wants churches who name Him to be solely under His authority; and that God ordained civil government as well as church government and that the two are so distinctly different that they are mutually exclusive - by that I mean that mixing church with state combines the holy with the unholy.

Dear Brother _____,

Since the 1980s, this ministry, and its predecessor, have helped many churches from many different states, organize under Christ and Christ alone.

I am here to help any church or church member understand New Testament Church organization under Christ alone (Christ as the *only* authority). A church which has chosen to incorporate, get 501c3 or 508c1A or any other type of legal status is under the authority of civil government, and has chosen to give up many of her First Amendment protections. She has betrayed her first love, the Lord Jesus Christ. These conclusions are based upon Bible principles concerning church government and organization. I explain these and many other matters in my writings, all of which are available online.

I do not particularly like the term "free church," a term I first learned from Peter Kershaw's books, online videos, and a seminar he spoke at in the late 1990s. Of course, any church is free to obey or disobey God if she so chooses, but God gives all one needs to know about His local churches in His Word. He gives many commandments, principles, and guidelines for His churches. God desires churches to conform to those commandments, principles, and guidelines. I prefer "church under Christ," or "New Testament church." That is a technicality, I know, but I believe the latter are more accurate, from God's standpoint.

Please forgive me for taking so long to get back to you. I just went back through my e-mails and noticed that I had never answered yours.

I do not know of any churches near you which are not incorporated. The closest one I know of is _____, Pastor _____: Los Angeles, CA [Phone No. given].

The answer to your question would take some time to explain. In a nutshell, a church can establish a trust in which all property is held in a trust estate owned by the Lord Jesus Christ. Such a church cannot have a bank account; but all gifts, tithes, offerings, are put in a bank trust account owned by the Lord Jesus Christ. Some banks will use the trustees SSAN, but if a bank requires an EIN, the trust can get an EIN "for banking purposes only."

That is another matter altogether; generally, childrens' homes are strictly controlled by state law and have to meet licensing requirements. The first church I was a member of after salvation in the early 1980s fought a battle with the state of TX over the licensing requirements. That battle moved me to go to law school. I entered the University of TX School of Law in 1990, and got my license in 1993.

I put them on the email list, etc.

May 17, 2020 Received Executed docs from Pastor _____, GA, via email attachment. He wants to open bank account asap. I emailed him congratulating him and thanking him for sending the docs plus reminding him to send the Appendix since without property in the Appendix, there is no trust.

May 18, 2020 Call from Bro. _____. Went over the procedures for opening a trust bank account. He wants to use an EIN, not his SSAN. I informed him to get back with me if the IRS mails him after he gets the EIN and tells him that he will have to submit IRS Form 1041 each year. Also, I sent him via email attachment the EIN PowerPoint which explains how to get the trust EIN "for banking purposes only." Told him to fill out the Form SS-4 and email it to me before submitting it.

May 31, 2020 Received form SS-4 from _____ for review before submitting the form requesting an EIN "For Banking Purposes Only." I had sent the trustee the line by line guide PowerPoint. Nevertheless, 3 mistakes were made in filling out the form. I e-mailed him the following:

1. Line 1 should be filled in (according to PowerPoint Line by Line Guide) as follows: _____ Trust.
2. Line 6 should be left blank (according to PowerPoint Line by Line Guide and also the instructions on page 2 of the SS-4). Line 6 says, "County and state where principle business is located. This common law trust is not a business. If you fill this in, it will misinform the IRS."
3. On the second line from the bottom put, "[Name of Trustee], Trustee;" (as on the Line by Line Guide) not "[Name of Trustee], Pastor," as you now have it. You are not here acting as the Pastor. You are acting as the trustee House of Prayer Trust. The church appointed you as trustee of House of Prayer Trust.

The rest of the form is correct. Please do not send it in before sending me the corrected form. Mistakes can cause very hard to correct problems in the future.

I am doing some initial research with my pastor on what it would take to dissolve our church corporation, so that we could submit our church to the- Lord as he intended. We are a small church in _____ California, _____ County and hold ... land, a parsonage, meeting house, one other building, and a checking and savings account. The original articles of incorporation are from the mid 1980's to early 1990's if my memory serves me well.

I have been perusing the biblical law center website and your jeraldfinney.com website. I could only glean in one essay that a 501c3 could not dissolve it's property without giving it to another 501c3 entity. Our church constitution/bylaws state that upon dissolution we must give the property over to another like minded 501c3 entity. I know we can change our constitution but would it stand up with the California Secretary of State if we made that change to allow us to enter it into a trust so we can become a new testament church. Is there a way for us to change our constitution and resubmit to the secretary of state and then later dissolve and transfer title to a trust. It is our ultimate goal to become a new testament church.

This is just a preliminary question and after hear back from you I'll report back to my pastor and advise him of how your ministry works and the questionnaire process that we would have to answer for you.

With the current Covid restrictions set by our state and county we are sure we will be subject to some challenges shortly as we are again assembling in obedience to our Lord. We stopped services for a short time initially to be prudent, but our pastor decided it was time to meet again. Praise God almost all our congregation as decided to come back to worship in person.

Just now getting to my emails received today. You need to check your CA non-profit corp. law as well as you by-laws. As long as the corporation is up and running, unless the law or your by-laws provide otherwise, the

corporation can convey property as well as obtain property. However, upon dissolution, the law probably requires that any corporate property must go to another 501c3 (incorp.) entity.

If you need to discuss this, give me a call. 512-785-8445. If you call and get a VM, leave a message and I will call you back asap. I will be tied up until 5 or 6 pm tomorrow. If you call, we can pull up the Calif. non-profit corporation law and see what it says.
